The FEI CODE OF CONDUCT for the Welfare of the Horse

- to acknowledge and accept at all times the welfare of the horse and never to subordinate it to competitive or commercial influences.
- during preparation and training of competition horses
This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation
- Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health

The FEI CODE OF CONDUCT for the Welfare of the Horse

- Events must not prejudice horse welfare
pay attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

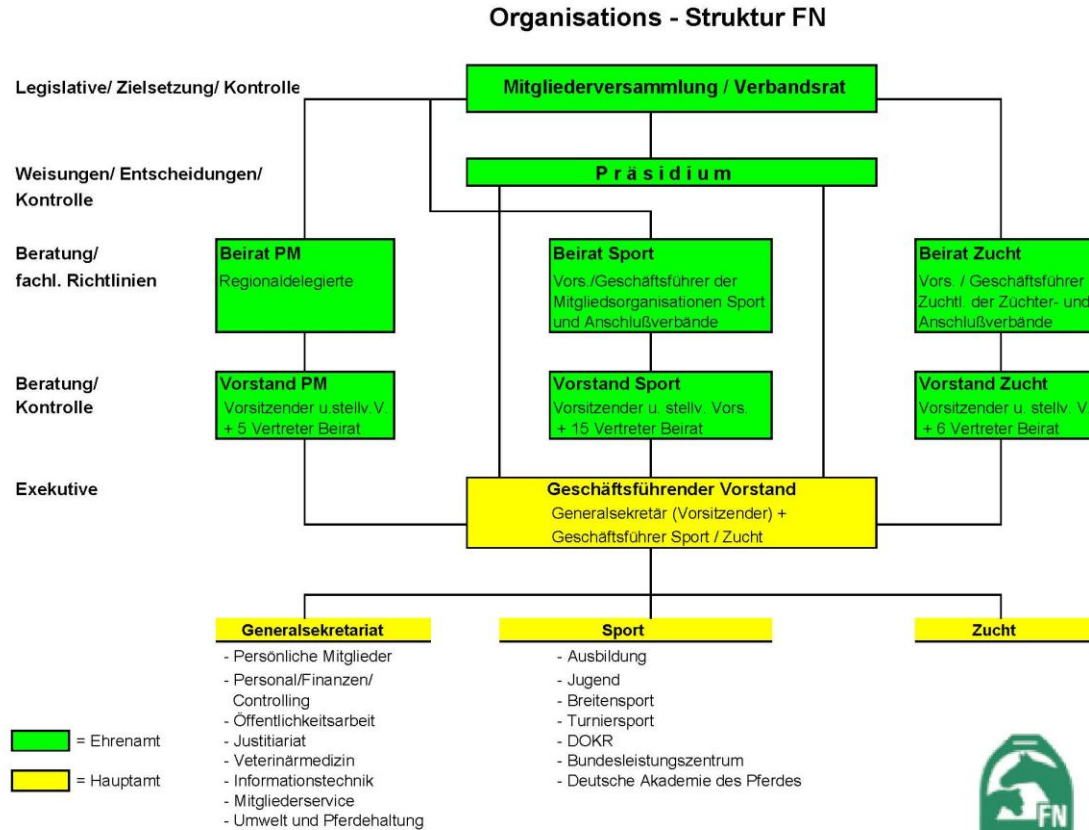

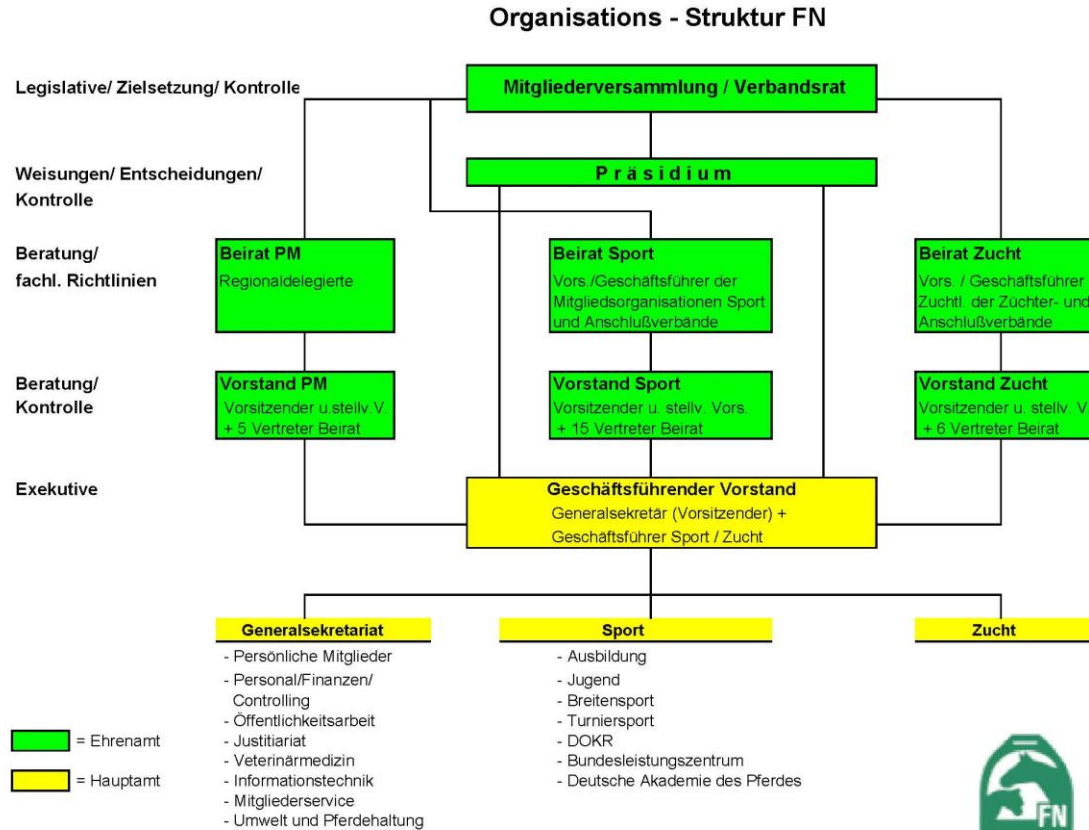

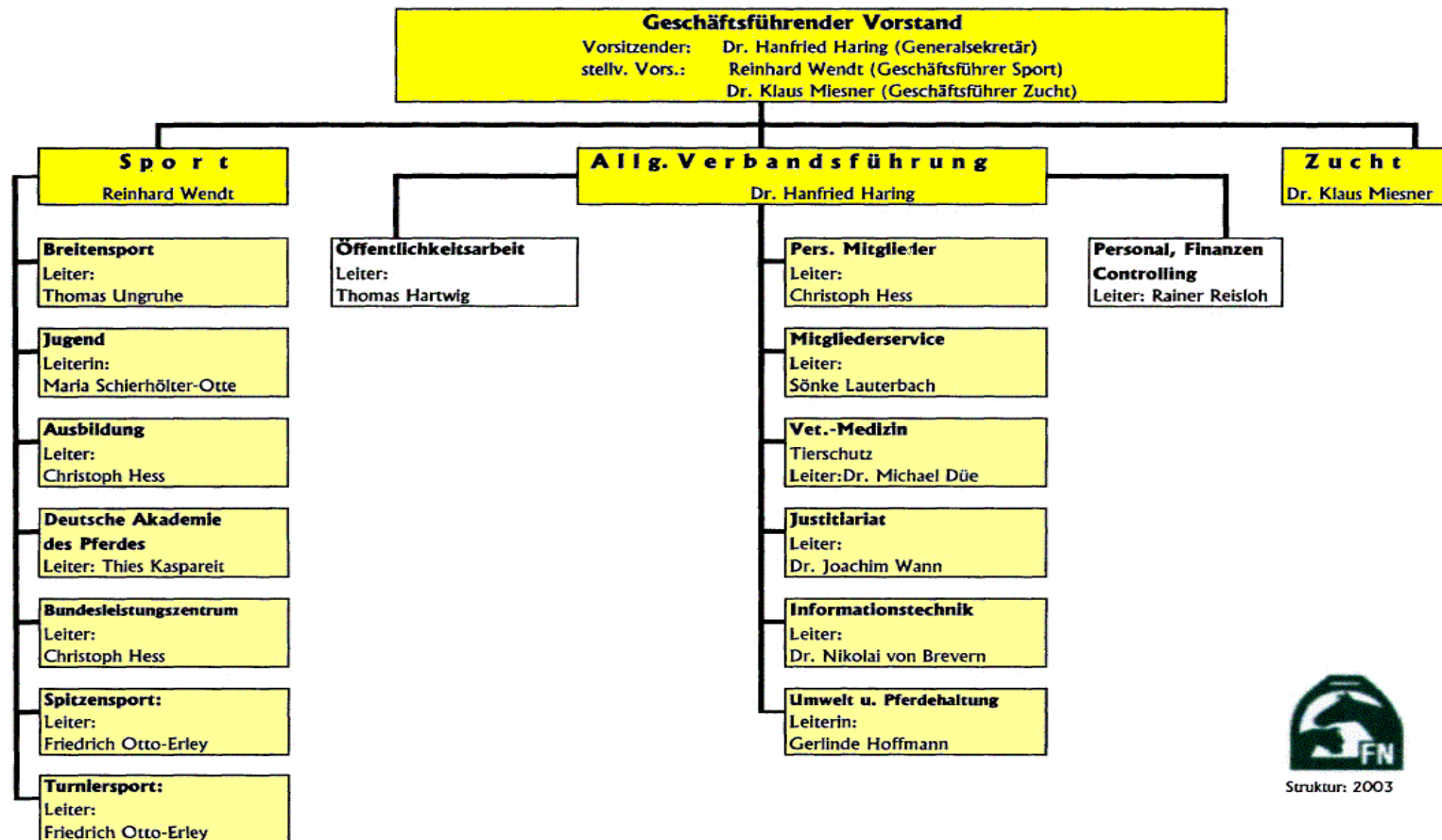

Langfristige Veränderungen in der Gesellschaft

- **Individualisierung** – traditionelle Autoritäten, wie Kirche, Parteien, Gewerkschaften oder Verbände verlieren an Einfluss
- **Bildungsexpansion** – Menschen werden kritischer, anspruchsvoller und selbstbewusster
- **Rollenwandel der Geschlechter** – Selbstverständnis der Frauen ändert sich, eine neue Ressource für das Ehrenamt
- **Demographischer Wechsel** – das Durchschnittsalter erhöht sich, ressourcen-starke ältere Generation (Gesundheit, Bildung, Geld und Zeit)

Strukturwandel im Ehrenamt

Früher – Idealismus und Selbstlosigkeit: sich für andere aufopfern, gutes tun, Dienst an der Gemeinschaft

Heute – Spaß am Ehrenamt: Menschen wollen ein abwechslungsreiches Leben, sich einbringen, entfalten bzw. verwirklichen

⇒ Projektförmiges Ehrenamt, zeitlich begrenzt

⇒ Betreuung des Ehrenamt (Qualifizierung, Fortbildung und Supervision)

⇒ Öffentliche Anerkennung

Maßnahmen pro Ehrenamt

- Faktor Wissen – Informationen per Email oder SMS – Seminare
- Faktor Mehrwert – Anreiz und Anerkennung von ehrenamtlicher Tätigkeit (Zielrichtung Jugend und Alter)
- Entlastung des Ehrenamtes durch Haupt- bzw. Nebenamt
- Werbewirksamkeit ehrenamtlicher Tätigkeit, die Aktionen ehrenamtlicher Funktionäre sollen andere zu dieser Tätigkeit anregen
